Kern Assistive Technology Center is a private non-profit collaborative that works together to assist people with disabilities be more independent through the use of technology. There are more than 80,000 people in Kern County who are disabled. Of these, only a handful are aware of life changing technology that can be accessed making their quality of life so much better. KATC has established an equipment loan program and computer lab with several programs available to the public to try before you buy. KATC was established as a 501 c-3 non-profit agency in 2001.

We have several services offered to our clients: Information and Referral, Loan Library, Consultation/Assessment, and Training. In the last year 100's of people with disabilities have been served in some way by KATC and we've informed 1000's of people about the services provided.
